Half Moon Bay is somewhat remote as Delegate Meetings go, but then they have a new clubhouse that many want to see and support. Let me know if you would like to attend one of these meetings or any of the other monthly meetings during the year. The dinners are usually very good, and sometimes excellent, and getting to know other clubs and members from all over Northern California is really enjoyable, and very important to spread the word of our new Clubhouse and to encourage participation in our activities.

The PICYA Commodores Ball and Installation (Change of Watch) of officers will be held at the Double Tree Hotel at the

Berkeley Marina on January 29, 2011. Our own Linda Breninger will be installed as Commodore; Mia Bernt, Richardson Bay and Little Venice YCs, will be installed as Vice Commodore and Lew Long, South Lake Tahoe YC, as Rear Commodore. There will be a PICYA Leadership Conference on February 26, 2010 at the Golden Gate YC. I always encourage the MWYC Officers to attend. It is even more important this year as we continue to get our new location re-established.

R.B.O.C. Report, Jack Michael SC, R.B.O.C. Director

It has been another very busy year for RBOC, and it is not letting up as I write this report. Last month I reported on the many RBOC accomplishments of 2010. Of course knowing that the State is still in a dire financial condition, and with the coming leadership change, RBOC is ever alert to a rip off of boater's dollars.

Also, with MWYC dues including a \$10 per membership assessment for a contribution to RBOC, I am also providing you with my annual reminder of what RBOC is all about. Recreational Boaters of California celebrated its 42nd year of protecting boater's interests this year. Over the years, these efforts have saved individual boaters thousands of dollars! RBOC is funded by voluntary member donations of PICYA member clubs and a donation from Boat U.S. based on the number of Boat U.S. members in California. There are eighteen RBOC Directors who serve voluntarily. Nine are appointed by PICYA and nine by SCYA (Southern California Yachting Association). I serve as one of those Directors and was elected by the RBOC Board to serve as the Vice President - North. A Sacramento lobbying firm, Desmond & Desmond, is retained to carry out the necessary lobbying efforts in Sacramento. They also provide the necessary administrative functions of the organization. This combined effort is the major expenditure for RBOC. The Board meets four

times each year with one meeting being a Legislative Day in Sacto to meet with Legislators and staff. These meetings alternate between Northern and Southern California. The Presidency of RBOC also alternates between North and South each year. The Director's transportation to these meetings is reimbursed from the RBOC budget, if requested, but all other expenses are paid by individual Directors. The President for 2011 is Linda Bendsen from Delta Marina and Encinal YC's. The Vice President – South, serving with me, is Cleve Hardaker from the Silver Gate Yacht Club in San Diego.

The \$10 assessment included in the MWYC by-laws for RBOC was adopted many years ago and has never been increased. Members are, therefore, encouraged to make additional donations. You can be assured that supporting RBOC is the most cost effective boating expense you have!

I will do my best to keep you up to date on the issues that will be most important to you, and ask that you keep me current on your concerns. Please stay tuned!



Monthly Safety Tips/Reminders—Safety Officer, Ed Stetson

SAFETY OFFICER – JANUARY

Spring and serious boating is just around the corner. It is time to check and service your safety equipment. Hopefully your boat is already properly equipped, but I'll review the regulations just in case you suffer from "senior moments" as I sometimes do. I have reviewed the USCG requirements and consulted the Power Squadron and Mad Mariner web sites to refresh my memory.

1. PFDs.
 - a. We all know we need a minimum of one Type III for each adult aboard and one properly sized Type III for each child aboard. If the child is under 12 aboard a boat under 26 feet they must wear the PFD. I insist that any child on my boat or dock wear the PFD, they are too precious to risk and if you provide an automatic inflatable jacket they are very comfortable. If you use inflatable PFDs, the Coasties don't count them if they are not "on the body". Another note on inflatables, replace the CO2 cartridge every two years just to err on the safe side. Inspect all life jackets every use, or at least every spring for frayed straps and broken buckles. Each jacket should be equipped with a strobe light and whistle, check and replace the batteries in the light every year.
 - b. If you go offshore, you need Type I PFDs for each crew member and they absolutely must have strobe lights, noise makers (whistles), and mirrors.
 - c. All PFDs must be readily accessible, not in locked cabinets and not still in the store packaging. If you store them in a locker, label it in large print and unlock it before getting under way.
2. Throwable Flotation devices
 - a. Any vessel over 16 feet is required to carry a throwable ring or other flotation device and should carry a line that can be deployed to recover someone from the water. Check that they are still in a readily accessible location and are in serviceable condition.
- 3.

FIRE PROTECTION

- a. Any boat over 16 feet in length is required to carry at least one fire extinguisher, two if over 26 feet. They must be mounted in a conspicuous location, readily available if needed. Think about where you, or other responders, would be if a fire broke out and mount enough extinguishers to assure they can be used to extinguish the fire or protect people escaping. They won't do any good in a locker. CO2 is the most versatile extinguisher, labeled ABC, for boat fires. Extinguishers must be serviced or replaced annually, now is a good time.
 - b. If your boat has a fire suppression system in the engine room, have it serviced and charged if necessary every year.
 - c. Gasoline inboards **MUST** be equipped with a flame arrester and positive ventilation. Clean the flame arresters annually and verify that the blowers are operating properly prior to every engine start.
4. SIGNALS, HORNS AND LIGHTS
 - a. Federal regulations require that you carry a minimum of three visual distress signals, including red flares and orange smoke signals. Check the dates on yours and make sure you have at least this number aboard that are not outdated. **It is Ok to carry outdated flares as long as you have the minimum number showing current dates.** Keep your outdated flares if they are visually sound, not showing any leakage or moisture. They are expensive and if you ever need them, three probably won't get you rescued. Store your flares in a dry place, readily accessible. Orion makes a waterproof canister that works very well.
 - b. Federal laws also require recreational boaters carry "Sound-Producing" devices so they can warn other boats of danger and exchange signals about what they and nearby vessels are doing. Your boat must be equipped with a horn and bell, make sure they work. It is also a good idea to carry an air-horn (a small canister that emits a loud noise when you push a button) or megaphone-style horn that makes a noise when you blow into it, if you need to signal when you have no power.
 - c. Navigation lights. You must have operational running and anchoring lights, and your boat came with them. Have you looked to see if the lights are all operating? Check today, and make sure you have spare bulbs before we anchor out.
